Did you know we have a Bylaw for Winter Road & Sidewalk Snow Clearing & Maintenance? Remember to keep vehicles off public roads when snow removal is taking place. Starting in Winter 2024, our Bylaw team will be ticketing vehicles that impede winter plowing activities.

New East Hants Well & Septic Loan Program

East Hants Council is proud to launch the new Well & Septic Loan Program. If you live in East Hants and need to fix or improve your well and/or septic system, you can apply for financial help. Council has invested \$200,000 in this pilot program.

Eligibility Considerations:

- You must be a registered Property Owner
- The property must be occupied by the Property Owner for a minimum of 6 months of the year
- Properties must be an existing detached, semi-detached or row house style home within the East Hants municipal boundary
- The total taxable household income must not exceed \$100,000
- There must be no defaults on municipal taxes, rates or charges

This program offers a fantastic chance for eligible community members to enhance their residential water and septic systems, resulting in improved water quality and/ or better septic services for their homes.

Be Weather Ready!

The weather in Nova Scotia can be unpredictable. The best way to prepare for storms is to plan ahead! Here are some ways to be weather ready:

Emergency Kits

Ensure you have adequate supplies to support every member of your household for a minimum of 72 hours without power. Don't forget to have a kit for your vehicle as well!

Protect Your Home

Make proactive weather-smart changes to your home and property. There are many simple, cost effective options to mitigate risks. Click the links to the right to access helpful resources to guide you through the weather prepping process.

Build Smart, Build Safe

Starting your next construction or renovation project? Having the proper permits in place will make sure the process goes smoothly and complies with municipal bylaws. Before you break ground, find out if you need a Building Permit, a Development Permit or both.

Projects such as new construction or additions to homes such as extensions, decks or any other accessory structure need a Building & Development Permit, regardless of size.

Accessory structures (i.e. sheds) require a Development permit if they are between 100 and 215 square feet.

Non-perishable food Can opener

- Pet food & water
- Medications

- First aid kit
- Batteries & charging banks
- Important documents (licenses, certificates, etc.)

Emergency Kit Essentials

• Water (1L/person per day)





Accessory structures over 215 square feet need a Building & Development Permit.

East Hants Business Technical Assistance Program

East Hants has partnered with the Centre for Entrepreneurship Education & Development to provide East Hants entrepreneurs with technical assistance in starting a new business or growing an existing business. There are three streams to this free program: Incubator, Accelerator and Advisory.

Incubator

The incubator is an intensive 6-week program that brings together aspiring entrepreneurs to discuss business ideas and how to bring them to life. Support and guidance are provided by entrepreneurial advisors with over 20 years of experience in starting, scaling and empowering businesses.

Accelerator

This program is focused on existing businesses. Whether you are trying to scale your business, or are facing issues with growth, this program can help move your business toward its goals. Sessions are tailored to small and mid-size enterprises with advisors who have extensive expertise in growing businesses.

Advisory

Sometimes a business challenge can benefit from oneon-one coaching with a subject matter expert. The Advisory Service allows an entrepreneur to work with an advisor on a business issue with a specific or limited scope. Advisory assistance is available in many areas.

2025 Property Assessments

In early January 2025, Property Valuation Services Corporation (PVSC) will mail your 2025 Property Assessment. This assessment amount will be used to calculate your 2025-2026 property taxes. If you have any concerns with the assessment amount, there is a 31-day period to appeal these assessments. Appeals or any other general questions can be directed to

Community Grants in Action

Mount Uniacke Mustangs Softball Association received \$26,582 in District Recreation Funds (cost-shared evenly from Districts 8 & 9) to replace dugouts and player benches at their main field. Old benches had become a safety concern for players. The fields are home to over 120 participants, from child and youth teams to adult recreational ball.

This summer, Coralee and her troupe attended the Dance World Cup in Prague, Czech Republic, representing Canada among 9,500 dancers from 54 countries! Coralee received East Hants Community Grant Funding to support her travels. They competed in the Children's Small Group Acro category and their piece, *Storm is Coming*, placed 16 out of 28 entries with a score of 90.5. Bravo Coralee!

2024 Election

Election Day is October 19! Here's everything you need to know to be ready:

Make sure you're on the voter's list

In order to vote, your name must be on the List of Electors (Voters List). Use our online Voter Look-up Tool at **easthants.ca/election** to make sure your name is on the list. If you need to make changes, our Elections team is ready to assist!

Know your district

East Hants reviewed and established new districts based on geography, community interests and population. There are still 11 districts. **Only voters in districts 3, 5, 10 and 11 will need to vote** in this year's election, as all other districts have acclaimed candidates. Find your district at **easthants.ca/election**

Why should you vote?

Voting in a municipal election is important because it directly impacts your local community. The decisions made by East Hants Council affect everything from public safety and development to road maintenance and community services. By voting, you help choose leaders who make decisions that shape your daily life. Your vote ensures your voice is heard and that your community's needs are addressed.

How to vote

Online & telephone voting opens at 8 a.m. on October 10, 2024, and will remain open until 7 p.m. on October 19, 2024. There are no in-person polling stations. All voting will be done online or by phone.

To vote, visit **easthants.isivote.com** or call 1-877-495-1897 during the voting period and enter the Personal Identification Number (PIN) sent to you via mail and your date of birth to access the system and cast your ballot.

eVoting guarantees your privacy — no one, not even election staff or candidates, can see how you voted. The system only confirms that a vote was cast and provides general statistics. It will never reveal individual choices.
